a) Intersection Control Study of Calle Castano and Cherum Road:

This study was initiated in response to reports of near-miss incidents at the intersection of Calle Castano and Cherum Road, attributed to motorists failing to yield the right-of-way. This indicates that the existing YIELD control does not provide sufficient regulatory emphasis to ensure driver compliance.

Recommendation

Per engineering judgement, STOP control is recommended for Calle Castano at its intersection with Cherum Road. This recommendation is based on the need to improve safety by clearly assigning right-of-way and requiring motorists on Calle Castano to come to a full stop prior to entering the intersection. The installation of STOP control would provide more definitive guidance, reduce ambiguity in driver decision-making, and enhance overall intersection safety.

b) Intersection Control Study of Castle Rock Road and Thompson Avenue:

This study was conducted in response to reported sight distance concerns at the intersection of Castle Rock Road and Thompson Avenue. Field observations indicate that motorists on Castle Rock Road must encroach into the intersection to obtain adequate visibility of approaching traffic on Thompson Avenue, creating a potential safety concern.

Recommendation

Based on MUTCD Warrant B (sight distance), the installation of all-way stop control is recommended at the intersection of Castle Rock Road and Thompson Avenue. Install STOP signs on the EB and WB Thompson Avenue approaches to Castle Rock Road and install ALL-WAY plaques on all intersection STOP signs.

c) Intersection Control Study of Mountain View Road and Sterling Road:

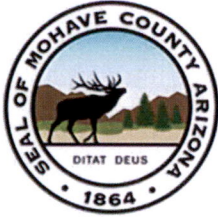
This study was conducted in response to public requests for all-way stop control at the T-intersection of Mountain View Road and Sterling Road following the recent extension of Mountain View Road from Sterling Road to Gardner Road which changed the characteristics of the roadway from an uncontrolled horizontal curve to a 3-leg intersection

Recommendation

No action is recommended at this time at the intersection of Mountain View Road and Sterling Road, as the intersection does not meet MUTCD warrants for all-way stop control.

- Sheriff's Office to place a Speed Feedback Trailer on Mountain View Road south of Sterling on the northbound travel lane.
- Traffic Control to review MUTCD regulations in consideration of relocating the 30 mph speed limit sign (Currently close to Sterling Rd. – Consider moving it closer to Garner Road).
- Public Works to place a traffic counter on Sterling Road east of Mountain View Road.




