PROPOSED FOOD CODE ADOPTION

07/03/25 Presentation given at the Kingman City Chamber Business & Government meeting. The purpose is to begin the conversation of proposing adoption of the 2017 FDA Food Code. Mohave County is currently on the 2009 FDA Food Code, adopted in 2014. The presentation provides an overview of the more and less restrictive Food Code changes, resources that will be made available to assist food establishments with the changes, and timeline of the Food Code adoption proposal.

NATIONAL ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH ASSOCIATION (NEHA) ANNUAL EDUCATION CONFERENCE

07/14/25 - Three Environmental Health division staff attended the 2025 NEHA Annual Education Conference (AEC) in Phoenix, Arizona. The NEHA AEC builds knowledge and professional relationships around environmental health best practices and emerging issues. Attendance also provides the required continuing education units (CEUs) for renewal of the Registered Sanitarian credential. Additionally, Environmental Health staff presented at one of the conference's scheduled sessions. Conference registration was funded through the NEHA-FDA Retail Flexible Funding Model Grant, awarded FY25.

- Investigated one suspect active TB case that was reported as a contact to an active TB case from prison; case living in a sober living facility. Staff worked with director of facility to complete the investigation. Case was ruled out.
- Follow-up of previous active case, 6 months chest x-ray. No new disease.
- Call from community member that was told their relative had “tested positive” for TB. The person was immune compromised. Spend a lot of time with this person and working with the provider office that tested the pt. In the end, the “case” had been tested for TB with IGRA due to a new medication they were starting. Initial result was not positive, it was indeterminate. They repeated the test which resulted as negative. The nurses provided a lot of education on TB and helped the family through the process until the final negative result was complete.


